Dear Best of Broadway Participant:

In the past several years many of you have attended one or more of the **Broadway Series** shows or indicated an interest in participating in this activity with the **University Presbyterian Church Adult Fun and Fellowship Group**.

The Broadway series shows for this coming season are now available and ticket requests for groups are being accepted. As noted above we will be attending the shows at DPAC. There are **no** Broadway series musical shows booked in Raleigh this coming year. There will be a few special shows. It appears that they are considering this type entertainment in the future at their new amphitheatre.

The schedule and prices for the shows at DPAC for the 2010 – 2011 season have been finalized and it is now time for us to enjoy selecting the shows that we would like to attend. According to the Football and Basketball schedule there is only one possible conflict. UNC has a football game with Virginia on November 13. The time has not yet been determined. It is TBA.

There are 7 shows in the Regular Series that are available for our selection. We will attend by bus only the shows where we have at least a minimum of 20 -25 people who plan to attend any show. If you feel that you will be able to attend any of these shows it is very important that you make your decision now or as soon as possible. Your selection may make it possible for us to reach the minimum on any one of the shows. As in the past we will be attending the Saturday matinee performances.

Enclosed you will find a summary sheet of all the shows and the price including the bus expense and driver gratuity applicable for the size group required for us to attend the shows. **This means that you will be able to select any show or shows that you would like to attend.** There will be **no** season ticket price. All of the shows are priced individually.

Your commitment at this time is very important, as previously indicated, and will determine the shows that we will be able to attend in 2010 & 2011. Your prompt response by the deadline of Friday, July16 is very important to the future success of this program. DO NOT SEND MONEY YET.

After receipt of the show selections from everyone who responds on the enclosed form, a second letter will be released to each person who plans to participate in the shows. This letter will advise the shows that we will be able to attend and how much money you will need to send for the shows.


Please note, if the purchase of all the tickets at one time presents a financial problem for you, a flexible payment plan is available for you. **All requests of this type arrangement are kept confidential.** We have had several people use this method of payment in the past several years. **One of the purposes of the Adult Fun and Fellowship fund is to provide opportunities for any of us to participate in activities that otherwise would be impossible.**

The ticket price for the shows this coming year are about the same as we experienced last year. Bus transportation continues to be expensive. Access to the Theatre at DPAC is convenient since we are able to unload and pick up at the Theatre entrance vs using the parking garages available that are 1 to 3 blocks away. All seats are anticipated to be in the orchestra section.

As in the past, a reminder letter will be sent to everyone involved 10 – 14 days before each show date. Every effort will be made to assist anyone who has a problem in attending one of the shows. This may be due to illness or conflict in a date with other activities unknown at this time. This past year, with a few exceptions, we were successful in placing most of the tickets that became available prior to the scheduled date. While there is no guarantee, we do feel that there will be possible opportunities to place the tickets with someone before each show.

Please help everyone involved by returning the attached form showing your selection(s) by Friday, July 16. Be sure to read the information enclosed on each show and have fun in selecting the shows you would like to attend.
